Anesthesia

Pre-anesthetic: Acepromazine (2mg/ml) .1 cc IM , Butorphanol (10mg/ml) .13 cc IM, PenGBP (150,000U/150,000U/ml) .7 cc SQ
Induction: Ketamine (100 mg/ml) .24 cc iv, Midazolam(5 mg/ml) .12 cc iv
Intubation: Endotracheal tube size 5
Maintenance: Oxygen 1L Isoflurane 2%
Monitoring: Pulse oximeter
Supportive care: Thermoregulation pad/blanket

A testicle was pushed up onto midline in the scrotal sac and a midline scrotal incision was made over the testicle (#10). The testicle was then exteriorized and freed of subcutaneous and connective tissue, manually with gauze. A carmalt was then placed over the vas deferens, cremaster, and vessels proximal to the epididymis. A single ligature (Miller's knot, 2-0 PDS) was placed proximal to the clamp and the testicle removed distal to the clamp. The clamp was then removed and the stump checked for bleeding. This procedure was repeated on the second testicle. The subcutaneous tissue was then closed using a single interrupted suture of 2-0 PDS. Tissue glue was placed on the skin.

Treatment Description:

S: P on vet check for geriatric exam including possible heart murmur and missing teeth. Patient was friendly, bright, and eager to exit the kennel.

O: PHYSICAL EXAM

HR: 110 Respiration: 30 CRT < 2sec BAR MM Pink BCS 3/9

EENT: Mild bilateral lenticular opacities OU. Mild superficial wound with focal alopecia on the nasal planum. Limited oral examination reveals moderate dental calculus and multiple missing teeth.

LN: no obvious lesions

Thorax: eupneic, no obvious signs of distress. Grade 3 to 4/6 systolic heart murmurs

Abdomen: soft, non-painful, no obvious lesions noted

Genitourinary: clean, no discharge noted

Integument: Mild non-pruritic alopecia over the caudal dorsal lumbar region.

Musculoskeletal: amb x4, no lameness noted today. Full ortho exam not performed.

Neuro: mentation appropriate, no gross deficits. Full neuro exam not performed.

A:

- Grade 3 to 4/6 systolic heart murmur: r/o cardiac disease, open

- Mild bilateral lenticular opacities: r/o age-related nuclear sclerosis, vs. cataracts

Superficial nasal planum wound with focal alopecia: r/o self-trauma, autoimmune or dermatologic disease.

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Moderate to severe periodontal disease with multiple missing teeth.

- Mild caudal dorsal lumbar alopecia: r/o flea allergy dermatitis, other allergic dermatitis, endocrine disease, or metabolic disease

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Underweight (BCS 3/9).

P:

- Cont tx per SP

- Diet: Canned/soft food only (severe dental disease & missing teeth)

- Monitoring: Check daily for limping (thickened left knee) and monitor the two masses (one fluid-filled on the left neck, one hard bump on the left front middle toe). Report any changes in size, redness, or pop/drainage to medical.

- Monitor for appetite, behavior and worsening condition and contact veterinarian if this occurs.

PERMANENT TRUST. DEFER in SHELTER. HEALTH WAIVER. Recommend a complete senior veterinary work-up, including cardiac evaluation, dental assessment, and evaluation of skin lesions by primary veterinarian.
