A dog's behavior in an Animal Care Center may differ significantly from how they behave in a home. Stress, confinement, and unfamiliar surroundings can cause dogs to act out or suppress behaviors that may emerge later. A dog's behavior may change based on surroundings, training, medical, socialization, and life experiences.”

Xena was at the back of the kennel with a tense body, hunched posture, concerned eyes, ears back, and a tucked tail. She was wary of the environment, and appeared to be sensitive to the sounds of the kennels. She was moved to the outside of the building, where she approached the runner with a neutral body. She was easy to leash and remove from the kennel, walked nicely on leash while bypassing the other kennels, and was easy to collar. In the catch pen, her body was neutral, her eyes were neutral, and her tail was neutral. She entered the yard, and greeted the other dogs with a tense body. She roamed the yard, keeping to herself as much as possible. She anxiously looked around for a way out of the yard before jumping on the table to avoid the other dogs. She was moved to the side yard with a small group of calm dogs, where she briefly greeted him before jumping on the bench to rest in the sun. She did not engage in play with the other dogs, but was able to coexist with a group of calm dogs with no issues. Xena is selective of the other dogs, has a low energy level, and does not have a playstyle at this time.
