Medical observation:

Unable to examine due to behavior

unable to handle, very reactive to injection. Cat in crouched position, did not observe cat walking or in upright position. Unable to physically check gender

S: On vet check for possible nasal discharge

O: PHYSICAL EXAM (limited exam) 10 mins

HR: uto Respiration: 32 CRT uto BAR MM Pink BCS 4/9

Patient:

EENT: serous nasal discharge and sneezing during examination. No oral exam today.

LN: n/e

Thorax: eupneic, no obvious signs of distress, n/e

Abdomen: n/e

Genitourinary: no obvious lesions/discharge noted

Integument: clean full coat

Musculoskeletal: hiding in den

Neuro: appropriate mentation, no gross deficits

A: Nasal discharge : FIRDC , open

P: OK to cont txt per SP

Monitor for appetite, behavior and worsening condition and contact veterinarian if this occurs. Feed canned food to entice appetite, if necessary.

If this patient continues to show signs after 7 days, bring to veterinarian for refill of medication. The infection may take up to 3 weeks to clear.

Pain medication: Zorbium (20mg/ml): 1 cc Topically- lasts for 3 days

O: Physical examination

Temperature- 101.2 Pulse- 200 Respiration- 24 MM- pink CRT- < 2 sec

EENT- mod. dental calc.

Cardiovascular/Respiratory- NSF

Behavior: limited exam before sedation-hissing, striking, difficult to work with prior to sedation

A: Patient is fit for surgery

P: Anesthesia

Pre-anesthetic: Convenia Inj 80 mg/ml: 0.46 cc SQ,

Induction: Telazol (100 mg/ml) 0.25 cc IM + 0.25 cc watsed / gas down w/ ISO + O2

Maintenance: Oxygen 2L Isoflurane 1%

Monitoring: Pulse oximeter

Supportive care: Thermoregulation pad/blanket

A scrotal incision was made over the left testicle and the testicle was exteriorized. The subcutaneous tissue was removed. The cord, cremaster, and vessels were then tied on themselves and the testicle removed distal to the knot. This was repeated for the right testicle.
