Eval Comments: The behaviors described today reflect the dog's responses in an Animal Care Center environment and during assessment. A dog's behavior in an Animal Care Center may differ significantly from how they behave in a home. Stress, confinement, and unfamiliar surroundings can cause dogs to act out—or suppress behaviors that may emerge later. A dog's behavior may change based on surroundings, training, medical, socialization, and life experiences.

Fatima A5784040 (Intact) was initially at the rear of the kennel but approached the runner with a timid demeanor and a soft tail wag upon arrival. She was easily leashed and exited the kennel on her own. Fatima proceeded to lead the way to the catch pen with a moderate pull on the leash, bypassing her neighboring kennels. Once inside the catch pen, she stood calmly during collar and leash placement. Fatima was allowed into the yard, where she greeted the handlers first, soliciting affection. She eventually began to sniff the other dogs, displaying a relaxed posture during these interactions. Fatima enjoyed roaming the yard with the other dogs, though she showed no interest in engaging in play. For the rest of the session, Fatima coexisted peacefully with everyone while continuing to wander around the yard. Fatima could benefit from continued socialization in a yard with calm dogs, as this may allow her to interact at her own comfort level and gradually develop her social skills.
