Eval Comments: The behaviors described today reflect the dog's responses in an Animal Care Center environment and during assessment. A dog's behavior in an Animal Care Center may differ significantly from how they behave in a home. Stress, confinement, and unfamiliar surroundings can cause dogs to act out—or suppress behaviors that may emerge later. A dog's behavior may change based on surroundings, training, medical, socialization, and life experiences.

Titus A5784919 (Intact) greeted the runner with a relaxed demeanor and a soft tail wag upon arrival. He was easily leashed and exited the kennel on his own. Titus proceeded to lead the way with a moderate pull on the leash, bypassing his neighboring kennels. Once inside the catch pen, he was collared and leashed without issue, along with a muzzle due to noted animal aggression reported by the previous owner. Titus was allowed into the yard, where he displayed a tense posture as he began exploring the environment. He ignored the other dogs, though he became tense and responded with a growl to signal for personal space as he continued roaming the yard. Titus occasionally approached the handlers to solicit petting. For the remainder of the session, he kept to himself, tolerating the other dogs from a distance. Once the session concluded, Titus was separated from the group to begin the resource guarding assessment. Due to his defensive response, Titus could benefit from a home without other dogs.

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Titus A574919 (Intact) was in the yard prior to the assessment. He ate calmly after the bowl of food was set down. He exhibited a neutral posture overall as the handler used an Assess-a-Hand tool to make contact with him and the bowl. His demeanor showed no concerning changes when the bowl was touched or moved away by the tool. Titus was allowed to finish before the bowl was retrieved without incident. Once the session concluded, he was returned to his kennel without issue. Titus showed no concerning behavior during the assessment; however, it is highly recommended to closely monitor for resource guarding behavior during feeding.
