A dog's behavior in an Animal Care Center may differ significantly from how they behave in a home. Stress, confinement, and unfamiliar surroundings can cause dogs to act out or suppress behaviors that may emerge later. A dog's behavior may change based on surroundings, training, medical, socialization, and life experiences."

Rascal A5785498 greeted the runner with a timid demeanor, he sniffed the runner but retreated to the back of the kennel when the runner attempted to leash him. The runner coaxed him, he entered his kennel to leash him. He placed the leash on him, Rascal wouldn't walk out, the runner used gentle leash guidance and coaxing to get him to walk. He walked nervously through the kennels. In the catch pen when he was introduced to the dogs his body was low, his eyes were concerned, his mouth was closed and his ears were slightly back. He was nervous to be collared and leashed but tolerant. He entered the yard and was nervous during his greetings with the dogs. He walked away, he kept to himself and roamed quietly. He was moved to the gentle/dainty yard. He was able to co-exist with the dogs if they left him alone. He walked away anytime the dogs overly hovered around him. Overall, Rascal was tolerant of the dogs, but he did not have a play style at this time. See handling assessment.

He was nervous but allowed the handler to pet him everywhere. He displayed no aggression, but he will require continued socialization, confidence building and slow introductions. Behaviorally ok for public adoption, large calm dogs required, adults only required with a KHOA for handling sensitivity.
