Eval Comments: “The behaviors described today reflect the dog’s responses in an Animal Care Center environment and during assessment. A dog's behavior in an Animal Care Center may differ significantly from how they behave in a home. Stress, confinement, and unfamiliar surroundings can cause dogs to act out or suppress behaviors that may emerge later. A dog's behavior may change based on surroundings, training, medical, socialization, and life experiences.”

Ruffles A5786486 was moved to the side yard to proceed with his handling assessment. He was nervous of the handler, when she got close to him, his body would slightly tense up. She asked the second handler to hold his leash to safely pet him. He allowed the petting everywhere, but he remained tense the entire time, his eyes were focused and his pupils were dilated, his mouth was closed and his tail was slightly high. When the handler stopped petting him, he began jumping on her (his body was very slightly tense), the handler corrected him, he ignored her verbal correction, but he got off her when she sprayed him with the spray bottle. Rescue only for handling sensitivity.

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Ruffles A5786486 (intact) was laying down when the runner approached him, he greeted him with a stoic demeanor. He was easy to leash but required coaxing to walk through the kennels. He kept distance from the runner as he walked on leash. In the catch pen when he was introduced to the dogs his body was slightly tense, his mouth was closed, his eyes were alert with dilated pupils, and his tail was low with no wag. He was wary being collared and leashed. He entered the yard and was tense during the greetings. The handler had to move the dogs away from him, his body was tense, his eyes were wide with dilated pupils, his mouth was closed and his tail was high and stiff. He never settled, anytime the dogs were near him, he continued to tense up. He was removed from the yard to not overwhelm the dogs. Overall, Ruffles was selective of the dogs and does not have a playstyle at this time.
