Eval Comments: "The behaviors described today reflect the dog's responses in an Animal Care Center environment and during assessment. A dog's behavior in an Animal Care Center may differ significantly from how they behave in a home. Stress, confinement, and unfamiliar surroundings can cause dogs to act out or suppress behaviors that may emerge later. A dog's behavior may change based on surroundings, training, medical, socialization, and life experiences."

Tink A5787986 greeted the runner with a relaxed body, soft eyes, a neutral wag, and relaxed ears. He was easy to remove, and he strongly pulled on leash. In the catch pen when he was introduced to the dogs his body was tense, he growled, his eyes were alert and focused and his tail was high and stiff. He was easy to collar and leash but difficult to muzzle, he yelped and whined, he attempted to remove the muzzle and flailed on the turf. He entered the yard and was tense during his greetings. He lunged at one of the soft dogs but as soon as the handler corrected him he stopped. He growled at one of the dogs who got close to him but stopped as soon as the handlers corrected him. He sat and rested his body against the handler's legs most of his time in the yard after that. He solicited affection from the handlers. Overall, Tink was selective of the dogs and does not have a playstyle at this time. Behaviorally ok for public adoption, no large dogs required with a KHOA for animal aggression.
