Treatment Description:

S: P is on vet check for geriatric exam including generalized alopecia, mucoid ocular d/c, and other derm lesions. P was txt prior to exam (see RVT notes dated 7/8/26).

O: PHYSICAL EXAM

HR: 120 Respiration: 32 CRT < 2sec BAR MM Pink BCS 4/9

EENT: Moderate bilateral mucoid ocular d/c OU. Bilateral pinna alopecia /lichenification. Bilateral ear canal thickening. No debris or d/c noted w/in ear canals following prior cleaning. Nose clean. Edentulous; missing all teeth

LN: no obvious lesions

Thorax: eupneic, no obvious signs of distress. Grade 3/6 systolic heart murmur.

Abdomen: soft, non-painful, no obvious lesions noted

Genitourinary: Mild mammary gland enlargement. Reducible left inguinal hernia. Vulvar swelling noted; no d/c observed.

Integument: Mild malodorous yeast-like odor. Generalized alopecia w/multifocal crusting and lichenification. Evidence of flea infestation. Nails overgrown.

Musculoskeletal: amb x4, mild abnormal gait. Mild bilateral stifle thickening. No lameness noted today. Full ortho exam not performed

Neuro: mentation appropriate, no gross deficits. Full neuro exam not performed.

A:

Generalized alopecia w/crusting, lichenification, and malodorous yeast-like odor: r/o flea allergy dermatitis, secondary Malassezia dermatitis, bacterial pyoderma, allergic dermatitis, endocrinopathy, ectoparasitism (including mites), or other chronic dermatopathy.

- Bilateral pinnal alopecia/lichenification and thickened ear canals: r/o chronic otitis externa, allergic dz, or other.

- Mucoid ocular d/c: r/o chronic conjunctivitis, keratoconjunctivitis sicca (KCS), age-related ocular disease, or irritation secondary to facial/skin dz.

- Grade III/VI systolic heart murmur: degenerative valvular dz, cardiomyopathy, or other cardiac dz

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Reducible left inguinal hernia.

- Severe dental dz

- Abnormal gait: r/o arthritis, degenerative joint dz, chronic medial luxating patella (MPL)

P: OK to cont txt as per SP

Monitor for appetite, behavior and worsening condition and contact veterinarian if this occurs. Feed canned food to entice appetite, if necessary.
