Surgery Report

Anesthesia

Pre-anesthetic: Acepromazine (2mg/ml) 0.9 cc IM, Butorphanol 10mg/ml: 1.1 cc IM,

Ampicillin 200mg/ml: 4 cc SQ

Induction: Ketamine (100 mg/ml) 1.5 cc IV, Midazolam (5 mg/ml) 1.5 cc IV

Intubation: Endotracheal tube size 11

Maintenance: Oxygen 2L Isoflurane 2%

Monitoring: Pulse oximeter

Supportive care: Thermoregulation pad/blanket

A 3 cm midline abdominal incision was made through the skin caudal to the umbilicus (#10). The subcutaneous tissue was then sharply removed (scissors), the linea Alba was tented and a stab incision was made through the linea Alba (#10). The linea Alba incision was then lengthened (#10) while protecting the internal organs with forceps. The right horn of the uterus was exteriorized with a spay hook. The ovarian ligament was then broken manually and the right ovary was exteriorized. A Carmalt was placed proximal to the ovary and a second clamp (Kelly forceps) was placed distal to the ovary. A single ligature (Miller's knot- 2-0 PDS) was applied to the ovarian pedicle proximal to the Carmalt clamp. The pedicle was then incised distal to the Carmalt. The Carmalt was then removed and the pedicle checked for bleeding before the stump was placed back into the abdomen. The left uterine horn and ovary were removed in a similar fashion. A Carmalt was then placed between the cervix and the uterine bifurcation. The Carmalt was removed and a single ligature (2-0 PDS-Modified Miller's knot) was applied to the uterus in the crimped edge. The Carmalt was then placed cranial to the ligature and the uterus was incised cranial to the Carmalt. The clamp was then removed and the uterine stump checked for bleeding. The abdominal wall was closed (2-0 Monocryl-simple continuous pattern). The subcutaneous tissue was then closed (simple continuous pattern-2-0 Monocryl) and the skin was closed (2-0 Monocryl-subcuticular pattern).
